## 2014 Road Scholar Season ends:

444 Adults from across the country as well as Canada, Australia, New Zealand and England have participated in the programs offered at Shepherd's Spring. Hiking the Appalachian Trail continues to be our most popular program. A new program hiking the AT in Maryland, gained 24 new participants! We had several returning participants and some of those have become valued volunteers as guides or hosts and in some cases both. Rick Burkhart, our Road Scholar coordinator was busy with 10 different programs over 23 weeks for a total of 30 programs. Looking ahead to 2015, we will be hosting 35 programs over a period of 26 weeks.

#### 2014 Heifer Global Village Season ends:

For another year our Global Village programs saw over 1,000 participants come from all over the Southeast and Mid-Atlantic United States to discover a little bit more about what life might be like for those less fortunate living in the U.S. and around the world. We gladly welcomed the new addition of Alpacas to our livestock crew, which serve as valuable teachers in explaining Heifer International's goal to end hunger and poverty through the gift of livestock. Our livestock are also an appreciated feature in several sessions of Summer Camp and even in a few Road Scholar programs. Two seasonal interns also gave their time and talents to making these programs a success – evidenced by there being already 5 groups with nearly 100 people signed up for Global Village programs in 2015.

## Resident Donates New Piano for Fahrney-Keedy's Parlor

A new Wurlitzer baby grand piano has taken its place in the Parlor at Fahrney-Keedy Home & Village, Boonsboro, and the retirement community has resident Florene Ritchie to thank for it.

'It's simple,' she said; 'I went and bought it; I just knew they needed it.'

The piano was purchased at Kramer's Piano Shop in Keymar, MD, and Ms. Ritchie says the store offered her a discount because the instrument would be coming to a retirement community. Given the choice between receiving a digital piano and an acoustic model, she said, Fahrney-Keedy executives advised her that they preferred an acoustic one.

Until this time, an antique piano dating from 1920 has been the Parlor's main instrument. It has numerous problems resulting from its age, Ms. Ritchie said. 'This lovely baby grand needs a lot of work,' she said, motioning toward the older piano. 'A good musician probably wouldn't want to play on it.'

Ms. Ritchie said she made her donation because, 'I know that people here love music – for their comfort, and to be happy.' In December, she said, she heard that a young piano prodigy scheduled to perform during the Festival of Wreaths event had not wanted to play the older piano in the Parlor, opting for one elsewhere in the building. 'He said he didn't want the Parlor piano to make him sound bad,' Ms. Ritchie said. That realization provided her the motivation to donate the piano.

# LIVES OF DEVOTION

Biblical approaches to spiritual life

Led by Bob Neff and Christina Bucher

April 29, 2015 • 9:00 am - 3:30 pm Elizabethtown College, Susquehanna Room

Biblical spirituality ranges from passionate pursuit of God to heated confrontation, from aching lament to simple prayers of petition. Biblical scholars Bob Neff and Christina Bucher take us beyond the Psalter to delve into the Bible's devotional texts and their varied spiritual "dispositions." How do these ancient expressions of piety compare to the modern ones we know best? How can the biblical examples enrich our own spiritual lives? How can they help us to understand religious expressions different from our own?

Participants will study Jeremiah 11 – 20, Job 38 -42, Song of Songs, and prayers in I and II Chronicles (especially the "prayer of Jabez"). Corinne Ware's work on spirituality in later Israel will be used to guide reflection. The format will include both lecture and discussion, with some questions posed to participants in advance.

Teachers will reference the Bible and the following resources:

- Bailey, Wilma Ann and Christina Bucher. Lamentations, Song of Songs. Believers Church Bible Commentary. (Herald Press, 2015).
- Ware, Corinne. Discover your Spiritual Type: A Guide to Individual and Congregational Growth (Alban Institute, 1995)
- Wilkerson, Bruce. The Prayer of Jabez: Breaking through to the Blessed Life. (Multnoma Books, 2000).

Participants are encouraged, but not required, to purchase these texts.
