Have there been times when you felt like everyone was working against you? If so, it might be a good time to reflect, **"What could I do to have healthier relationships and better control of my emotions?"** Research shows that individuals with high levels of "emotional intelligence" tend to have happier, healthier, and more successful lives. **This workshop will help participants better understand what "emotional intelligence" is, recognize its impact on their personal and professional lives, and increase this capacity in themselves.**

Dr. Don Booz, a former Church of the Brethren pastor and District Executive, will lead this day-long workshop on emotional intelligence for leaders. Dr. Booz was certified as a professional coach by the College of Executive Coaching and the International Coaching Federation. He is recognized for his expertise in linking emotional intelligence and experiential learning to personal and professional objectives. His book, due out this year, will discuss how to apply emotional intelligence to everyday life situations.
